EAA occasionally opens its Attic doors for visitors to view its eclectic collection of everything aviation. This year's tour is Saturday, April 14, at 10:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. It's a great opportunity to see thousands of historical items up close, like this shirt from the Bill Adams Air Show, several personal photo albums such as this one highlighting aircraft from the National Air Races between 1937 and 1939, or this rare (and delicate) fabric stripped from a captured German World War I aircraft in 1918.

You can also see many of the items that have appeared on this page each month, including the mystery tank from

the February issue. We received several letters about that item, and in case you missed the answers in March's Members Forum, it is an oil tank from the left engine of the Martin twin-engine bomber YB-10/B-12 series, built in 1933.
